

WINTER WRAP UP: <u>EDUCATIONAL UPDATES FROM THE HAMM</u>OND RESEARCH STATION

We always expect the winter season to be busy. Between Gulf States Hort Expo (GSHE), Landscape Professional Education Days, and our annual Certified Nursery and Landscape Professional (CNLP) and Pesticide Recertification events, the months of January and February are full of events to combat the slow, dreary season of winter. What we did not expect was record snowfall in our area – encasing our communities in a layer of snow that delayed our industry's annual conference at GSHE in Mobile. But, like we always do, we turn obstacles into opportunity, hosting our



hallmark conference in the hospitable confines of the Hammond Research Station (HRS). But let's back up a bit and cover all the educational efforts that were conducted during this time. February 18th and 19th was our annual CNLP manual review at the Hammond

Research Station. Nearly two-dozen attendees advanced their landscape careers by attending this two-day training session, covering critical concepts for both the Louisiana Horticulture License and the CNLP certification. Investing in your (and your team's)

education ensures that you are protected legally and provided the professional credentialing to represent yourself and our industry. We had an engaging class of students that exuded enthusiasm for keeping Louisiana horticulture blooming, and I look forward to working with them at each step of their professional development. It was fun, as always, covering a wide range of topics (19 chapters in two days!), but the next day we honed in on pesticide-specific programming. February 20th saw several students from the CNLP class join seasoned pesticide applicators at our annual pesticide recertification event at Hammond. We had a wealth of speakers share their insights on best management practices and business considerations for pesticide applicators, including Drs. Hayes (water management), Ashbrook (ant control), DeBoer (turfgrass weeds), and Singh (plant diseases), as well as our new HRS trial garden coordinator, Caroline Blanchard. Bryan Gueltig, Tad Kivett, and Joe Ingrao assisted in ensuring applicators had their registration information taken care of to remain compliant. Thank you to all our participants, presenters, and staff for their efforts.

After a marathon three days of education, we had the chance to briefly catch our breath before the following week's events. The Landscape Professional Education Day Series is a statewide endeavor initiated with the LNLA to ensure that our industry has educational resources directly provided to them throughout the state. To date, we have brought a rotating lineup of speakers to different areas of Louisiana – (Lafayette in spring of '21; Ruston fall of '22, Lake Charles spring of '23, New Orleans fall of '23, Baton Rouge spring of 24', and Bossier City in fall of '24), and spring of '25 saw a return to home base – the Hammond Research Station.

We hosted over 30 green industry professionals at the HRS on the morning of Thursday, February 27th, where they were met with insights from Drs. Singh, Hayes, and DeBoer on their respective research areas, and Dr. Allen Owings shared some of his favorite plant varieties for the upcoming season. Our Landscape Professional Education Days are always a big party, lasting all day. However, this one was slightly different – we had a bigger party to attend in the afternoon.

While winter weather wreaked havoc throughout the Gulf South while we were preparing for GSHE, we weren't going to allow a little snow to cancel our LNLA annual conference. The afternoon of Thursday, February 27th was the LNLA Annual Conference where over 150 LNLA members and green industry supporters descended upon Hammond - joining our morning Education Day's roster. With pleasant weather, we gathered outside under the tent to share news and updates on all things AgCenter and Agriculture. Dr. Mike Strain (Louisiana Commissioner of Ag and Forestry) and LSU AgCenter administrators Drs. Salassi, Smith, and Gentry shared updates important to our industry. LNLA leadership Lisa Loup and Cari Jane Murray led discussions on information important to our members. Our next generation of green industry professionals were supported through the LNLA scholarship ceremony, demonstrating the LNLA's commitment to supporting the future of the landscaping and nursery industry in Louisiana. Last, but certainly not least, the industry awards ceremony highlighted the contributions of individuals throughout our collective team. I have more words on that in an accompanying article.

Closing the month of February was one last educational event – but this time, we broke free of the boundaries of the classroom. Hands-on workshops are a unique opportunity to learn new skills, where building upon the success of our January 2024 patio install workshop, we hosted an outdoor fireplace workshop. Thanks to the generosity of our sponsors, Scott Lunt of Outdoor Bistros (for providing the fireplace frame) and Geoffrey Sandifer of Ewing Irrigation (for providing the stone veneer), we continued the next installation iteration of the HRS Outdoor Living Lab. Thank you to Cari Jane and the entire LNLA, as well as SELNA, for providing support and snacks for the event. Special thanks to Eric McQuiston for conceptualizing elements of this



soon-to-be focal feature of the HRS. We look forward to hosting events in the future as we continue to build out more sections of this unique garden area. With everything, it takes a team to succeed. Providing the opportunity for people to get their hands dirty and learn new skills while also contributing to a communal area creates a lasting educational impact that we can enjoy for generations.

As we flip our calendars to the spring season, we have much to be thankful for after a busy winter of educational events. But our work is just beginning. I look forward to continuing to develop educational activities with the entire team as we seek to advance all our green industry professionals. Up next on the agenda? Continuing with our horticulture manual revisions so that the most relevant, up-to-date information is included.

Green Industry Witnesses Sizeable Growth Over the Past Two Decades

Dr. J. Matthew Fannin, Agricultural Economics and Agribusiness

The Green Industry is composed of sectors connected to production, retailing, and delivering services around products generated from the nursery and landscape sector. This brief highlights the current economic contribution of the industry to the economy of Louisiana.

Green Industry Worth \$4 Billion in 2024

The Green Industry in Louisiana has been an increasingly important part of the economic landscape of the state. Recent estimates by the LSU AgCenter point to the total contribution of the industry exceeding \$3.98 billion in 2024. This represents growth of 222% growth from the contribution the industry made in 2002. Of the \$3.98 billion, approximately \$2.5 billion were direct effects (output generated by Green Industry sectors) as well as an additional \$1.4 billion in indirect effects of businesses connected to the Green Industry and spending by households from employees connected to the industry shown in Table 1.

Landscaping Services Lead the Way

While households still enjoy working in their own yards and gardens, households, business, and government increasingly outsource these to professional landscapers. Landscaping services include licensed landscape horticulturists, licensed arborists as well as related service activities. The delivery of these services generated over \$1.68 billion in direct output in Louisiana, representing just over two thirds of all direct output of the Green Industry.



Breakdown of Direct Contribution of the Green Industry in 2024.

Many of the other subsectors of the Green Industry contributed between \$100 and \$200 million. The resurgence of people playing golf that started during COVID continues to contribute over \$204 million. Greenhouse/nursery production which has a long historical foundation in the Green Industry produced products that valued almost \$180 million in 2024. Wholesale categories contributed the least with combined wholesale value adding just over \$15 million.

Exports Dominated by Greenhouse/Nursery Production

As a portion of the total output of the Green Industry, exports (both domestic and foreign) made up just over \$156 million, or 6.17% of total output in 2023 (latest year export data available). However, a smaller number of sectors contributed most to these exports.

Exports for Greenhouse/nursery production represented over half (55%) of total Green Industry exports at almost \$86 million. The second largest contributor to exports was golf courses and country clubs. Over 18% of exports in 2023 was generated by tourists and other guests from outside the state playing at Louisiana golf courses.

Paid Employees and Entrepreneurs Contribute to Louisiana's Workforce

The Green Industry has become an example of an industry that has an entrepreneurial spirit to meet demands of the marketplace. In 2024, the industry contributed almost 34,000 jobs to the overall state economy from paid full-time and part-time employees as well as the full-time self-employed. However, that does not encompass all the work opportunities that have been met by people working in the industry.


A sizeable number of businesses that participate in the industry work part-time. A classic example includes individuals that strictly mow lawns part-time while holding other part-time or full-time jobs. These part-time self-employed individuals make up a sizeable portion of additional jobs.

In 2002, part-time self-employed in the Green Industry totaled just over 2,000 jobs. By 2024, these part-time entrepreneurs totaled more than 16,000 jobs, an eight-fold increase.

When including these part-time self-employed with total paid and self-employed jobs, totals jobs in the Green Industry are estimated at 50,563 for 2024.

Looking at the total Green Industry job increase between 2002 and 2024, it is estimated that almost 19% of that growth came from paid employees and full-time self-employed. Approximately 78% of that growth came from part-time self-employed and three percent came from additional indirect and induced jobs.

The Green Industry has shown resilience over the past 22 years through multiple national recessions as well as natural and technological disasters that have impacted consumers in the state. As the taste and preferences of consumers change, the industry will be challenged to adapt to the changing marketplace. If recent trends hold, the industry will use its entrepreneurial acumen to identify opportunities that continue to grow the Green Industry throughout the remainder of the decade.

The LSU AgCenter and LSU provide equal opportunities and employment.



A few notable things that Chauncey has done in the past several years includes:

- Participated in over a dozen mission trips to Honduras thru churches that he is affiliated with
- Multiple Mission trips to Guatemala
- Three Mission trips to Nepal, one of which was to educate the farmers on growing apples to yield a better crop and creating a co-op network, this trip required several months of physical preparation to be able to hike into sparsely inhabited regions.



THE FUTURE EFFECTS OF CARBON CAPTURE

AND SEQUESTRATION (CCS) ON LOUISIANA'S NURSERY AND LANDSCAPE INDUSTRY

Louisiana's nursery and landscape industry is deeply rooted in our state's unique natural environment. From lush gardens to expansive tree farms, our industry thrives on healthy land, clean water, and stable property rights. However, the rapid expansion of carbon capture and sequestration (CCS) projects across the state presents significant concerns that every member of the Louisiana Nursery and Landscape Association (LNLA) should be aware of.

While some might assume CCS only affects industrial sites or rural farmland, the reality is that these projects could have far-reaching consequences for landowners, businesses, and communities—including those involved in the nursery and landscaping sectors.

How CCS Could Impact Our Industry

1. Land Use Restrictions & Eminent Domain

CCS projects require large underground storage sites for captured CO2. These sites are often located beneath private and agricultural lands, including those used for nurseries, tree farms, and landscape businesses. Under current eminent domain laws, companies can force landowners to allow these projects without full consent or fair compensation. This means that even if your land is currently unaffected, future projects could expand, putting your property rights at risk.

2. Environmental & Water Contamination Risks

Many CCS injection wells are being permitted near vital water sources, including the Chicot Aquifer, which supplies water to millions of Louisianans. If CO2 storage leaks or interacts with underground minerals, it could lead to soil degradation, groundwater contamination, and unforeseen environmental consequences—all of which could negatively affect plant growth, soil health, and long-term business sustainability for those in the nursery and landscaping industry.

3. Reduced Property Values & Business Uncertainty

When CCS projects move into an area, land values can plummet, creating economic instability for property owners and business operators. Landscapers, tree farmers, and nurseries depend on stable, healthy land for long-term operations. If future buyers avoid areas with underground CO2 storage, how will that impact your business investments?

Why Your Voice Matters – Support Legislative Action

Even if CCS is not yet in your district, this is a statewide issue. Several Louisiana legislators are carrying bills in the 2025 legislative session to reinstate landowner rights and ensure public voting on CCS projects. Two of the most critical bills are:



 HB4 – The Right to Vote on CCS Projects

This bill, introduced by Representative Charles "Chuck" Owens, seeks to give local communities the right to vote on whether CCS projects can move forward in their parishes. Currently, decisions are being made without citizen input.

• Eminent Domain Protection

Several legislators are working to restrict eminent domain abuse by CCS corporations. Without these protections, corporations can take private land for CO2 storage, forcing business owners to give up control over their properties.

Take Action - Protect Your Industry and Future

The Louisiana CO2 Alliance is a grassroots organization dedicated to educating, organizing, and advocating for landowners, business owners, and communities affected by CCS projects. We are working directly with legislators to ensure that Louisianans have a voice in this fight.

- Call your state representatives and senators and ask them to support HB4 and eminent domain protections.

WATER MOVEMENT: SUBSURFACE VS. SURFACE POND OXYGENATION

Dissolved oxygen is a driver of pond health and vital to the surrounding ecosystems. The aquatic life in a pond can be drastically reduced or stressed in the event of low dissolved oxygen. In most cases, photosynthesis from aquatic plants is the primary source of dissolved oxygen in the water column. Ponds that do not have this natural flora can use mechanical operations like subsurface aeration or fountains to help promote oxygen in the water, but each has its benefits.

Subsurface pond aeration or "circulate" can come from a diffusion system that uses air compressors to pump air into the bottom of the pond. The air then bubbles up to the surfaces creating a current of water that lifts low-oxygen water from the bottom to the top. This results in the mixing of layers (up to 5 feet in depth) and prevents stratification in the pond. These systems typically use less energy and are easier to install compared to alternative methods. The water circulation technique oxygenates a larger volume of water making it a better habitat for fish and plants. Though existing aquatic weeds will not be impacted, the bubbling effect can reduce the risk of blue-green algae, which thrives in stagnant water. While these systems provide habitat benefits, there are



concerns about using them in shallow water systems where the bubbling may impact the shoreline causing erosion. Additionally, they do not provide the same aesthetics as fountains and require periodic maintenance due to the potential exposure to sediments and mud at the bottom of the pond.



Pond fountains are a staple for most settings

due to their aesthetics and capability to oxygenate water from the surface. In most cases, surface fountains are the least efficient way of oxygenating the pond depth profiles and have a minimal effect on stratification. These systems generally draw surface water that is already oxygenated promoting a habitat benefit up to 2 feet in depth. These units come in a variety of sizes and are deployed for aesthetic functions. Another benefit of fountain features is the dispersion of water around the surface of the pond creating turbulent water which reduces the impact of mosquitoes and algae growth. A disadvantage of these units is an increase in energy consumption and maintenance requirement for clogging if the pond has high levels of sediments or aquatic vegetation. Additionally, only oxygenating the surface water level limits habitat growth and concentrations of fish populations. To increase the oxygenation potential of a fountain, water can be circulated from deep in the pond using a higher-pressure pump or extended tubing.

Each pond has different dimensions, water depths, and natural fauna, therefore it is best to think about your entire ecosystem before deciding on the best aeration practices. It is important to note that pond turnover, or the natural vertical movement of water with different temperatures, typically occurs during the cooler months in fall and spring. In the summer, dissolved oxygen levels must be monitored to ensure you don't create a "manmade" turnover in your pond. Overall, there are many ways to increase the dissolved oxygen in your pond to create a healthy, balanced ecosystem. SOIL SAMPLING: THE FOUNDATION OF RELIABLE SOIL TESTING RESULTS

Sometimes, we spend a considerable amount of time thinking about where to send our soil samples for analysis, but we often overlook the quality of the soil sample itself. Most private and public certified soil testing laboratories have extensively trained personnel, proper equipment, and research-proven protocols to conduct soil analysis. Ultimately, how we perform soil sampling will dictate how accurately the soil test report reflects our soil's fertility. To ensure reliable results, consider the following guidelines during the soil sampling process:


Fig. 1. Graph from Shaddox et al. (2019) showing how quickly Fe forms become unavailable to turf when applied to the soil. For reference, Wolftrax is Fe-oxide, Vigiron is Fe-humate, and sweet iron is Fe-polysaccharide.

Take a representative soil sample: A representative soil sample involves dividing the area to be sampled into smaller subareas based on different characteristics such as soil type, color, past management, and yield. The size of the area should also be considered, and a single composite sample should not cover more than 5 to 10 acres (Figure 1). Once the subareas are defined, collect 15 to 20 cores from each subarea.

Collect at the proper soil depth: The LSU AgCenter currently recommends collecting soil samples at a depth of 6 inches. A shallower sample (less than 6 inches) may overestimate the results in the soil testing report because the soil layer closer to the surface generally contains higher amounts of organic matter. This organic matter can supply nutrients to plants and retain applied nutrients from fertilizers in plant-available forms, preventing leaching or unavailability.

Be mindful of timing: Soil sampling is generally recommended in late fall or winter for most crops. However, the most important criterion is to collect samples at the same time each year (or every 2-4 years). This consistency allows for fair comparisons of nutrient levels and excludes fluctuations due to active plant growth.

Avoid contamination: Simple actions, such as using clean buckets, can significantly impact the results shown in your soil testing report. Mixing soil samples in dirty buckets, especially those previously used for fertilizers, minerals, or feed, can overestimate the results.

Properly handle and label your samples: Use clean buckets or bags and properly label each sample. Labeling with the field name, farm name, location, date, depth of sampling, previous crop, and the crop to be cultivated helps track the sample's origin. Submit the samples promptly to the soil testing lab for routine analysis. Keeping records of how the area was divided into subareas can also be helpful for future samplings.

Do not dry your samples: Never dry your samples in an oven. While soil samples are dried at the Soil Testing Lab, they are dried at low temperatures (below 140°F) for an extended period (24 to 72 hours). Drying samples at temperatures

above 140°F (60°C) can cause chemical reactions that alter the amounts of plant-available nutrients, rendering the samples unusable.

Finally, when choosing a lab, consider the following criteria:

Send your soil to the same laboratory each year: Even though properly selected certified Soil Testing Labs have similar procedures, slight differences in sample handling may yield different results. Consistently using the same lab makes it easier to track old reports.

Ensure the laboratory uses Mehlich-3 methodology: Mehlich-3 is the standard nutrient extraction method for which Louisiana recommendations were developed. Using a different extractant will not allow for proper fertilizer and lime recommendations for that area. Different extractants are developed for different regions based on soil characteristics, and Mehlich-3 is the one that better represents plant available nutrients for Louisiana soils.

The LSU AgCenter Soil Testing Lab, located at 125 M.B. Sturgis Hall on the main campus in Baton Rouge, provides soil analyses and interpretation for a small fee. ARE YOU GETTING THE MOST GREEN FOR YOUR BUCK?

When it comes to turfgrass quality and dark green color, there are probably two nutrients that come to mind: nitrogen (N) and iron (Fe). Nitrogen will always be king when it comes to turfgrass fertilization. However, N is not always the best choice for every situation. Here's why:

Nitrogen is a macronutrient that is a major component of chlorophyll (our dark green pigment) and is also required for amino acid, protein, and enzyme synthesis. These processes drive turfgrass cell division and expansion, resulting in flushes of growth after N fertilization. This vegetative growth stimulation is often at the expense of root growth (adequate N is still necessary for proper root growth, too). When N is readily available in high amounts, plants often allocate more resources toward aboveground biomass, leading to rapid shoot elongation and leaf expansion. Additionally, applying N too early in the spring can encourage excessive shoot growth, producing tender, succulent tissue that is highly susceptible to late-season frost damage. In the fall, promoting succulent tissue growth as the turfgrass plant should be preparing for winter dormancy can also cause a whole host of other issues we won't discuss in this article. Here's where Fe comes in, providing a boost of green color without stimulating excessive growth.

Iron is a micronutrient, and it mainly functions as a cofactor in chlorophyll synthesis and electron transport (look up Ferredoxin). This means that for chlorophyll to be synthesized and for a range of metabolic processes in the plant, Fe must be available in adequate supply. Iron does not directly contribute to amino acid production and, therefore, doesn't contribute to flushes of growth like N. Just like not all N fertilizers are the same, not all Fe fertilizers are created equal. Additionally, how they're applied plays a significant role in their efficacy or ability to produce a greening response on turf. The issue with Fe fertilization is that granular- and liquid-applied sources of non-chelated Fe quickly become unavailable to the plant once incorporated into the soil. This effect is most pronounced in high-pH soils (basic), but even in soils below a pH of 7 (neutral to acidic), non-chelated Fe can quickly become unavailable as it is converted into insoluble forms, such as Fe oxides and hydroxides.

Soil Reaction: Applied Fe 3+ + 3H 2 O = Precipitated Fe(OH) 3 + 3H + In fact, Shaddox et al. (2019) showed that the vast majority of Fefertilizers available in the turf market become essentially completely unavailable in the soil in under 1 hour, depending on the degree of soil acidity (Fig. 1).

Figure 1 clearly shows that the only forms of Fe that remain in soil solution for any meaningful amount of time are Fe chelates, like Fe-EDTA, Fe-DTPA, and Fe-EDDHA. These forms can be pretty costly to apply on a large scale. If you don't want to spend money on expensive forms of chelated Fe, you can circumvent the soil Fe-oxidation processes altogether and apply foliar Fe directly to the plant leaf.

Iron source becomes a non-issue when applied directly to the leaf surface as a foliar spray. In turfgrass response studies conducted between 2014 and 2018 by the same authors, the foliar application of Fe resulted in the same greening response between Fe sources regardless of whether the Fe was chelated or not. The authors consistently observed no effect on turfgrass color from soil-applied

Fe, but that same form of Fe applied as a foliar spray resulted in a greening effect.

In order to make the most of your foliar Fe applications, use a carrier volume of less than 2 gal / 1,000 ft2 (1 gal / 1000 is ideal) and target a rate of 2-4 oz. of Ferrous Sulfate (~37% Fe) / 1000 ft2 of turf or about the equivalent of less than 0.05 lbs of actual Fe / 1000 ft2. Remember that if foliar-applied iron gets washed off the leaf and into the soil, oxidation will occur, as previously discussed. Make sure to allow plenty of time for plant absorption of the Fe before irrigation or rain washes it off the leaf surface. Use a surfactant in your spray solution to achieve better leaf coverage.

LARGE PATCH IN LOUISIANA LAWNS

Large patch (formerly called brown patch) is the most common disease of lawns in Louisiana. The disease can occur on all warm season turfgrasses, but is particularly prevalent on St. Augustine grass. Symptoms appear as yellow, circular or irregular shaped patches of disease that can become quite extensive. As the disease develops, large areas of turf appear brown as smaller patches coalesce. Affected St. Augustine grass exhibits a yellowish cast at the leading edge of the patch, whereas centipede grass shows a reddish cast. The pathogen does not kill the grass but rather cause a rot at the base of the leaf sheaths resulting in easy separation of leaves from the crown of the plant.

Large patch is caused by a soil-borne fungus Rhizoctonia solani. Optimal conditions for disease development occur when nighttime temperatures range from 60-75 degrees and daytime temperatures do not exceed 85-90 degrees. It is important to remember, however, that disease can still develop when conditions are less than optimal. Although we usually think of large patch as being a disease of the fall, it also develops quite often in the spring. Free water on foliage is required for disease to develop. The disease spreads rapidly on lawns with poor air circulation.

One way to reduce disease incidence and accelerate turfgrass recovery is to maintain a healthy lawn through balanced fertilization and irrigation and regular mowing. Never apply more than 1 pound of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet for an application, and always follow soil test recommendations for proper fertility. Large patch symptoms are exacerbated with excess nitrogen application. Slow-release fertilizers with a balanced amount of nitrogen and potassium are recommended. Irrigate lawns as early as possible in the morning while taking rainfall into account. Water deeply and as infrequently as possible without causing drought stress. Improve internal soil drainage and reduce compaction by aerating the lawn regularly. Minimize the amount of shade and improve air circulation over the lawn. Raising mowing height will help the turfgrass to recover. Do not mow lawns when wet and mow diseased areas last because disease may spread to healthy areas with infected grass clippings. Cleaning lawn mowers to remove


grass clippings may help reduce the spread of the disease.

Excessive thatch can negatively affect turfgrass growth and provide a suitable environment for the pathogen. Dethatching may be necessary to improve turfgrass growth.

In addition to cultural practices, fungicide applications may be required to achieve effective disease management. When using fungicides, always remember to follow the label rates and frequency of



application. Fungicides containing active ingredients such as azoxystrobin, myclobutanil, propiconazole or triadimefon may be used to manage large patch. At least two fungicide applications are recommended, the first being mid- to late September and the second in mid-to late October. Additional applications may be required in November and December during frequent rainy and cooler weather. In areas where large patch is known to have occurred previously, an application of a fungicide in mid-March at "green-up" is also advisable. Again, during extended period of cool, wet weather in the spring, additional fungicide applications may be necessary. 


Fred Straughan
